“A Day in the Life of an Activity Director” Presented by Joe Agnello, MS, MA, Hospice Chaplain, Volunteer Coordinator, Transitions Hospice in Illinois

This session is intended to be fun and highly participatory. Using an assessment center technique called an “in-basket” exercise, participants will respond to emails, memos, notes, call-offs, phone calls and other interruptions. Participants will individually decide how they will handle these typical problems that occur in the daily routine of an Activity Director. Through small group discussions, participants will learn how others manage the same issues.

“Therapeutic Activities at the End of Life” Presented by Joe Agnello, MS, MA, Hospice Chaplain, Volunteer Coordinator, Transitions Hospice in Illinois

Every Activity Director can be inspired by knowing that activities can honor and promote a meaningful life for residents who are dying, whether or not they are in hospice. Excellent care for residents at the end of life can be achieved through pain control, therapeutic touch, reminiscing, life review and life enrichment activities. We can’t go back in time to make changes, but we can use the present moment to make meaningful, therapeutic choices. Through experiential exercises, you will be prepared to use the activities in your program.

“Working with the Difficult Dementia Resident” Presented by Carol Dippold, M.A. Carol is the Geriatric Care Manager with Lutheran Family and Children’s Services of Missouri

“Meaningful Activities in Culture Change: Tips and Tricks of the Trade” Presented by Cindy Ballard, MCAD

Learn how to create an activity program that engages residents in meaningful activities making their life more pleasurable. We will discuss creating an activity program on a tight budget and creative ways to engage staff and volunteers. We will open the floor to discussion of meaningful activities and exchange ideas. Learn how to create activity programming with an emphasis on developing person-centered activities.

- Participants will understand the importance of person-centered activities.
- Participants will learn the steps required to plan and implement individualized activity programming.
- Participants will hear how the presenter has engaged residents for increased participation.
- Participants will learn how to be creative on a budget and how to utilize volunteers and staff to organize an effective activity program.

Cindy Ballard has been in the nursing home field since 1982. She started out as a CNA, becoming an Activity Assistant in 1985 and has been an Activity Director for 30 years. She has completed a 30-hour course to gain certification. Cindy has been involved in, or is a member of, several organizations including ADAM, KADA, NAAP and has served on various committees and held offices in those organizations.
